Annual Report By Virginia Beta Board

Financial Condition

On behalf of the Virginia Beta Board, I am pleased to report that the Fraternity remains in outstanding shape with an active membership of some 50 undergraduates and the premises at One University Circle in good condition. As always the House is operating on a sound financial footing with an annual budget of some \$238,750 funded by rent, dues and meal plan revenues. Some \$70,000 in reserves and alumni contribution remain invested in the Phi House, Phi Investment and Phi Educational Endowment Funds under the auspices of the UVA Fund at Alumni Hall. Since January 1, 2015 \$14,500 has been received in gifts from Virginia Beta alumni, actives, parents and friends.

House Leadership

The Board is most impressed with the quality of the leadership at the House. Exec, in 2016 under the Presidency of Derek Rush '17, has navigated an exemplary year at the University. As you may be aware a number of UVa fraternities have been cited for various forms of misconduct; happily Phi Society has maintained a clean slate in 2017.

As reported last year, in the wake of the *Rolling Stone* article, even though it was later determined to be based on multiple falsehoods, a growing concern regarding sexual assault took hold at the University. Consequently, each active signed a pledge not to engage in such behavior. The House has also upgraded its risk management policy and actives have participated in various awareness sessions conducted at the University regarding risk management and sexual assault.

Meal Plan

Some older alumni will recall that the House had a cook who prepared meals and that very nearly all members would have lunch and dinner at the House. Beginning in the 1990s, almost all UVa fraternities replaced cooks with catering services. In recent years at Phi Society, because of class schedules which for some included evening classes, participation in dinners at the house declined. This year under the leadership of Scott Oswald '90, the VAB Executive Committee has worked with the undergraduate Exec to revitalize the Meal Plan program at the House. Currently all 2d years (Class of 2019) are on the full meal plan and all actives participate in the Sunday night dinner before chapter meetings. It is anticipated that next year all 2d and 3d years will be on the full meal plan.

Facility Management

The house at One University Circle continues to be well managed by Piedmont Facilities Management (PFM). The VAB Board has been very pleased with the work of PFM which throughout the year oversees routine maintenance and this year has undertaken major work such as painting parts of the House exterior and the interior trim. New furniture is to be purchased for the Chapter and Virginia rooms most of which has been in the House for some 15 years or more. Also the house is pleased to have received a rug donated by Tom Faulders, '71.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As 2016 comes to a close, it is important to call to mind the recent accomplishments of the brotherhood and its current state. Throughout the year, Phi Society has continued to build upon its stellar reputation on grounds and has put itself in a position to thrive in the future at the University.

Extracurricular Activities

Phi Society has continued to remain active in both the University and greater Charlottesville communities. Active brothers are currently participating in groups such as Student Council, Tom Tom Founders Festival, UVa Athletics Media Relations, UVa Division of Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine, and the Center for Behavioral Health and Technology. Additionally, active Phis have taken a number of leadership positions outside of the fraternity; for example, Bryan Pfirrmann ('17) is the Student Council President of the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy and the Field Organizer for the Jane Dittmar Campaign for Congress, Carl Liles ('17) is the Social Chair for the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy Undergraduate Council, Jack Parkhurst ('18) is the Vice President of Finance for nation-wide Net Impact comference, and Eli Connell ('18) is a Project Manager for the Rivanna River Conservation Society.

Athletics

The brotherhood has also built on its past athletic success. Scott Patterson ('17), Blake Ruzich ('17), Andrew Duran ('19), and Aldomaro Algarra ('19) play on the club soccer team. Patterson and Ruzich serve as the team president and treasurer, respectively, as they lead the team to the Club Soccer National Tournament this Fall. Matthew Kimble ('18) plays on the club basketball team, Jacob Maupin ('18) plays on the club lacrosse team, and Thomas Yozzo ('18) is a coach for the club wrestling team. Additionally, Kelvin Rainey ('17), a Phi Society social brother, is the starting strong safety for the UVa football team.

Internships and Careers

Each year the members of the brotherhood accepts full-time positions with reputable companies. Philanthropy Chair Clay Neal ('18) has done an exemplary job of organizing service outings and philanthropy events for the brotherhood. This past fall he organized the 2nd Annual Phi Splashdown benefitting the Wounded Warrior Project. Brothers have volunteered their time with a number of organizations this past year. These include Madison House, Latino and Migrant Aid, the Charlottesville-Albemarle Rescue Squad, Charlottesville Soccer Academy, Pancakes for Parkinsons, and the Rivanna River Conservation Society.

"In Coelo Quies Est"

Charles Claude Carroll, Jr. ("Charlie") '57 in Charlottesville on October 26, 2016 at the age of 87. He was predeceased by his late wife Ruby D. Carroll in January, 2016. Charlie is survived by his daughter Cynthia Carroll Dyer of Waynesboro, and two step sons, and three grandchildren. Charlie was born in Charlottesville on August 1, 1929, the son of Claude Carroll, Sr. and Nadine G. Carroll. After serving in the US Army from 1951 until 1953, Charlie graduated from the University of Virginia, McIntire School of Commerce in 1957. Charlie was a member of Phi Delta Theta as had been his father Claude. Both Charlie and his father served for many years as Chapter Advisors to the fraternity. During the period when the fraternity separated from the national organization in 2000, Charlie and a number of his pledge brothers actively supported the leave taking the and the establishment of Phi Society. An avid lover of all University sports, especially UVA football and basketball, Charlie unfailingly declared at the beginning of each season that "This year is their year!" and attended as many games as possible, never wavering in his support.

Ernest Pascal Zobian Jr.(Col '61) of Ocean Grove, New Jersey, died March 10, 2016. At the University, in addition to his membership in the fraternity, he was a member of the baseball team, German Club, and Skull and Keys. He was famous for his shenanigans in front of his basement apartment on Elliwood Avenue and erudite observations of world politics which he would gratuitously transmit at random times and places. EZ took his 3d year abroad in Mexico where, among other things, he was cast as a Mexican soldier in the film, "The Alamo." After leaving the University in 1961, he pursued a career in publishing and independent writing. He passionately advocated for the environment and wrote on the dangers posed by discharges from nuclear power plants. EZ was known for his wide array of hats and his wit. He enjoyed baseball, bike rides, the beach and reading the New York Times. Survivors include a son, a daughter, two grandchildren, and three siblings. Scattering of his ashes took place in the advent of high tide at the beach at Ocean Grove on September 10, 2016.


