Rush Results

Brothers' hard work is evidenced by the fact that through each round the Chap-



ter retained roughly 70 percent of the guys who showed up to the previous round. Seventy percent is a very solid number (higher than previous years), especially in a year when many rushees dropped part of the way through.



Capital Campaign Raises Over \$142,000 2018-2019 Results

The Capital Campaign just finished what can only be described as a milestone year. Thanks to the immense generosity of 117 Delta alumni, actives, and friends, we collected more than \$142,000 in donations towards our chapter house renovation and improvement efforts. We now have over \$415,000 in the bank and another \$98,800 in pledged donations, which means we are officially on course to reach our \$500,000 fundraising goal, assuming pledged donations are funded!



Of course, much of our success this year is thanks to Brother Bill Schmidt's call to arms in January. Bill made an incredible offer to the fraternity to donate \$30,000 of stock provided it could be matched by \$30,000 in donations from the rest of our alumni. Forty-three alumni, actives, and parents answered the call, donating more than \$46,000 in response to Bill's matching offer! We are very grateful to everyone who participated, and especially grateful to Bill for all he has done to inspire the Brothers of the Delta Chapter.

If you haven't yet donated or pledged to the Capital Campaign, we encourage you to do so! In Bill Schmidt's own words, **"You don't have to give a lot, but just don't be a ZERO!"**

Construction Timeline

Given the unprecedented success of this campaign to date, we are tentatively bringing forward our construction timeline and hope to break ground on the renovation and new addition to the chapter house as soon as spring 2021. However, it's important to note that **we still have a way to go before we can break ground:**

- We need to collect the outstanding pledges to reach the full \$500,000. If you have made a pledge to the campaign, it's very important that you continue to fund it.
- Our current mortgage is scheduled to be paid off in 2023. If we want to start construction sooner we will need to pay down the remaining balance, most likely through additional donations.
- Construction costs are always a moving target. The more donations we receive before breaking ground, the better chance we will have of successfully executing our full renovation and expansion goals. So, if you have been waiting for the right moment to jump on the bandwagon, this is it!

Donor Recognition





First and Second Floor Plans and Room Naming Rights

The naming rights for every room in the house are being offered in exchange for donations of \$10,000 for single bedrooms, \$25,000 for double bedrooms, and \$50,000 for common area rooms. Brothers Elliott Woltz '70 and Stephen Mewborn '80 have each snagged a bedroom. The Brother Room has been named in honor of Brother William Schmidt '66 after several of his Brothers pooled together more than \$50,000 of donations. And of course, John Rich '68 made a very generous donation at the outset of this campaign to secure the naming rights to the Great Room for the Class of 1968. Other communal spaces and bedrooms remain available for naming. Anyone who sponsors a communal space for \$25,000 or more will also receive a framed print of the house plans.

Annual Financial Report

In the spirit of transparency, here is a reconciliation of the AT Ω Alumni Association and Capital Campaign's 2018-2019 fiscal year financials. The #1 goal of the Capital Campaign is to raise money to fund our house renovation and expansion plan. However, we still have certain year-to-year financial obligations such as house repairs that we need to cover. The Fall Reunion was our largest expense, but was offset by ticket sales and other donations. So stripping that out our expenses were about \$7,360 for the year. Not included in this is a \$4,500 annual administration fee from Alumni Hall, which should have been billed this fiscal year but for some reason wasn't; so we may see it twice next year.

As we mentioned in last year's Dispatch, we have been investing our excess cash balance into UVIMCO's Short Term Investment Pool, a conservative bond strategy meant to roughly track the performance of 1-year Treasury Bills. In the most recent fiscal year ending May 31, 2019 we earned \$10,728 in interest at an average annual yield of approximately 4.12%, firmly exceeding our benchmark of beating inflation. Our returns benefited both from an increase in short-term interest rates as well as a one-time capital gain distribution in late 2018. Special thanks are owed

to the talented professionals at UVIMCO for the exceptional results.

We remain sharply focused on controlling expenses to ensure that donations are spent as wisely as possible. All accounts are professionally managed through the UVA Alumni Association, and the BOT has adopted formal cash management policies and procedures to ensure responsible stewardship of these funds, which we are happy to share with anyone interested in reviewing them.
