#### Beta Notes



The brotherhood would like to share some of our renovations we have made to help make our house even better: we have added a new sitting area to our sun deck, have made several additions to our professionally cleaned rock garden, including a manmade fire pit, projector screen, and a table to eat at. In addition, we have built and painted a DJ booth, constructed a new bar, and installed additions to our current party lighting system to further the decor of the house.

The brothers are in the process of planning a deck addition to the side of the house to allow for a more functional outdoor setting as opposed to simply the rock garden. ## Chi Phi Approaches Major Milestones

We should take enormous pride in the fact that in less than two years, Chi Phi will be the first college social fraternity to celebrate its bicentennial anniversary. 2024 will also mark the 165th Anniversary of the Alpha Chapter and the 100th Anniversary of our beloved Chapter House.

A Chapter House does not a Fraternity make, but it has served us incredibly well as a domicile and gathering place for many decades of Chi Phi brothers. It has been important part of our history and remains critical to our future growth and relevance. Since the completion of construction in 1924, the facade at 161 Rugby Road has remained relatively unchanged. However, in the spirit of modernization and to address the anticipated wear, there have been numerous repairs and renovations over the past 60 years. Basement, roof, bathroom, and kitchen renovations, floor replacements, HVAC, and a sprinkler system are some of the improvements that have been undertaken to maintain the quality and safety of our property. This summer we are planning to renovate the third-floor bedrooms with the secondfloor bedrooms to follow next summer.

Our Chapter has two accounts with the UVA Fund. These "chapter specific" accounts were established 20+ years ago and are held as:

The Alpha Chapter Excellence Fund (FAA263), for need based scholarships, and The Chi Phi Alpha Home Association Fund (FAA262), for capital improvements. Donations to either fund provide the donor with a gift recognition to the University's Annual Fund. Even though we have not undertaken any major fundraising projects since 2009, we continually have brothers who donate to these funds. We are most appreciative for their ongoing generosity and sincerely welcome new donors.
