ANNUAL REPORT TO VIRGINIA BETA ALUMNI

On behalf of the Virginia Beta Board, I am pleased to report that the fraternity remains in good shape with an active membership of some 45 undergraduates. The premises at One University Circle continue to be maintained in good condition, all the more so due to the restored dining room which has generated improved participation on the House's meal plan.

House Leadership

This past year, the House executive committee was well managed under the leadership of President, Terence Moriarty '23; Vice President, Drew Johnson '23; Treasurer, Tanner Lewis '23; and Secretary, Carter Paulen '23. For 2023, the actives recently elected Jack Meaney '24 as President.

In addition to these fine young men, we are proud of the House's leadership throughout the University and Charlottesville community. Indeed, no matter the decade, one thing remains true: we have always recruited a well-rounded group of actives who excel both academically and athletically, in clubs and philanthropy. Facility Management

The House remains in good physical condition, although there are regular maintenance items to address. We utilize the services of Piedmont Facilities Management to regularly inspect the building and arrange for repairs. The dishwasher, faucet, and ice machine were replaced in the kitchen, and contractors updated the smoke detectors and lights. We are also looking at a few larger maintenance projects for the near future as well. VAB Trustee, David Edwards '90, a resident of Charlottesville, serves as Chapter Advisor. He and VAB Trustee, Ajay Malik '04 are the point persons for repair projects.

House Meal Plan

The brotherhood is taking advantage of the dining room on the first floor, which was restored following the removal of the two bedrooms and bathroom constructed in 1988. This allows the actives to enjoy lunch and dinner in one location and eliminated dining in scattered areas of the House. The brothers continue to appreciate healthy and nutritious choices available to them from chef Trish Tye.

UNDERGRADUATE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings from One University Circle! As COVID-19 rates subsided and classroom mask mandates were lifted, student life at UVA has returned to normalcy in 2022. The brothers of Phi Society welcomed this change with open arms, as it has allowed for a more traditional and holistic collegiate and fraternity experience. Here is an update on undergraduate Phi affairs and accomplishments from the past year:

Rush and Initiation

Due to the circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic in Charlottesville at the time and shifting University restrictions, the 2022 rush process had its challenges. Initially, Open House was to take place online, with the following rounds to occur in-person (with limitations). The University later modified its policy and required that the remainder of rush be conducted online. Despite these changes to our plans, Phi Society was still able to produce a pledge class of fifteen outstanding Phis. While we were not able to present bids at the dorms, the new pledge class was able to celebrate Bid Day in-person at One University Circle.

In April, the 2022 pledge class was initiated at a ceremony led by outgoing President, Kevin Cox '22, and the new President, Terence Moriarty '23. The fifteen new Phis were thrilled to receive their Phi ties and formally join the brotherhood.

Extracurricular Activities

As always, Phi Society brothers are active throughout both the University and Charlottesville community. Nicholas Chuckas '23 is a member of the Rock Climbing Club, MS Society, and the Order of Omega; JD Etz '23 works as a TA for a computer science course; Ryan Smith '23 is a Charlottesville Debate League tutor, VISAS language consultant, and private tutor to local high school students; Ryan Smith '23 and Joseph Harrell '25 are members of the Jefferson Literary and Debating Society; Lorenzo Allorto '24 is a member of the Virginia Case Club; Decker Bristow '24 is on the Engineering Team for UVA's Forge; Jack Meaney '24 is a member of the Sports Business Club; Ryan Rosenberg '24 is in the Tamid Group at UVA, and Josh Zimmermann '24 is a member of the PKG Concert Planning Committee.

Philanthropy and Volunteering

Under the direction of Philanthropy Chair Nicholas Chuckas '23, we held several successful fundraising events in the past year. In the spring, Social Chairs Jake Flynn '24 and Kieran O'Dell '24 worked diligently to coordinate the first ever Phi Rodeo, a philanthropy event in the front yard that included t-shirts, a mechanical bull, and bales of hay. In October, we held a fundraiser at Crozet Pizza, where attendees purchased a wristband for food and drink deals. A 50/50 raffle at Parents' Formal also contributed to our fundraising efforts. Beyond spreading awareness, we raised over \$1,000 for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation and for Michael Blankenbecler (who coached Kyle Brumbaugh '21, JD Etz '23, and Tanner Lewis '23 in high school volleyball and is battling brain cancer).

Outside of philanthropy, a number of active Phis have made a commitment to giving back to the community through volunteer work. Tanner Lewis '23 volunteers at the UVA Hospital. Lorenzo Allorto '24, and Noah Bennetch '24 are involved in Creating Assets, Savings, & Hope (CASH), where volunteers provide free tax preparation services for low- and moderate-income community members in Charlottesville. Lorenzo Allorto '24 is also a volunteer for the Big Siblings program through Madison House. Shan Akiraj, David Beiger, Decker Bristow, Marcos Gonzalez, and Kieran O'Dell, all class of 2024, tutor underserved high school students in Mississippi with the Global Teaching Project. David Beiger, Decker Bristow, and Marcos Gonzalez even flew to Mississippi for in-person tutoring as part of this program. Thomas Reiter '25 volunteered this summer as a counselor for Camp Kesem, which is a free week-long camp for children who are affected by a parent's cancer. He is an executive member of the organization's UVA chapter.

Social Scene

As expected, the social calendar post-Covid restrictions led to the creation of many memories for the brothers of Phi Society. Notable social events from the past year include a mock wedding between Noah Bennetch '24 and a member of Alpha Chi Omega, Splashdown with a waterslide in the front yard, and Beach Formal in Oak Island, NC. These were of course accompanied by a number of other parties, date functions, and brotherhood tournaments.

Similarly, Jack Meaney '24 will be studying in Valencia this summer.

Given the achievements of recent graduates as well as current Phis, it should come as no surprise that members of Phi Society had a cumulative GPA (all semesters) of 3.61 as of the 2022 spring semester. The average spring 2022 GPA of 3.56 ranked eighth among thirty-one Interfraternity Council chapters. It is worth noting that nine Phis achieved a 4.0 GPA in that semester.

House Band

In spring of 2022, the house band, Spoonfed, continued with their second semester of playing together. REMEMBERING TIM ROSE '98

On Monday, September 26, 2022, we lost our Brother, Tim (often Timbo) Crawford Rose '98. Tim is survived by his wife Emily; his daughters Carley (14), Linley (12), Whitney (9), and Cloey (6); his father Danny Rose, mother Shirley Jean Holland Wright, and stepfather Timothy Wright; his sisters Sonya Rose Hall (James), Ashleigh Wright Suttmiller (Matt), and Kelleigh Wright McMillan (Paul); many aunts, uncles, cousins; and countless friends.

Tim was born in Chesapeake, Virginia, where he excelled at mischief, friendship, and baseball, so much so that he was drafted as a pitcher out of Great Bridge High School by the Chicago Cubs. Notwithstanding his baseball prospects, Tim attended the University of Virginia where, by the accounts of many classmates, Tim pursued a robust college experience, inside and outside the classroom. Tim spent the fall of his first and second years “studying” and the spring in Florida with the Chicago Cubs affiliates. In 1994 Tim proudly announced that he was joining MLB’s player strike – permanently. As a result of his semesters in Spring Training, Tim was rewarded with a fifth year on Grounds – courtesy of the Cubbies. As in most endeavors, he won.

After college, Tim moved to Atlanta, Georgia, where he lived with several Phis and began his career in medical device sales. More importantly, during his time there Tim met Emily (at a Doug Clark & The Hot Nuts show), his loving wife of 17 years. In 2005, Tim and Emily moved to Richmond, Virginia, where Tim later founded Ashlawn Medical, a successful medical device sales company.

To the delight of Phis from the mid-90’s, Tim once fraudulently induced a fellow Phi to submit an extensive application – replete with multiple essays – for a fictional law school scholarship. These antics are legendary, and exemplified how much he loved to laugh, which was exceeded only by his love of inducing the laughter of others.

Tim was an avid collector of friends, and he treasured his expansive collection, including many Phis from many graduating classes. He boasted perfect attendance at birthdays, bachelor parties, weddings, anniversaries, and Phi alumni events. If you knew Tim well, you’ll fondly remember his hugs, which entailed being hoisted up, squeezed, set down, slapped on the back, and called a nickname, which of course, he’d supplied. He was a fiercely loyal supporter of his fraternity brothers and the University and maintained lifelong commitments to each.

Of Tim’s many passions, none were more important than his devotion to his beautiful family. Tim’s “Rose Petals”, Emily, Carley, Linley, Whitney, and Cloey, were the loves of his life. He was a regular presence on sidelines of Richmond athletic fields, and with his girls at the home games of his beloved Wahoos. Tim’s was a life well lived, and he enriched the lives of countless others.

HARRY R. MARSHALL LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Every five years, the Phi Society issues the Lifetime Achievement Award to an alumnus brother who has achieved success in his life or career and deserves recognition for following the pillars of the Fraternity: friendship, sound learning, and moral rectitude. To honor the legacy of Harry Marshall, the Fraternity recently renamed the award as the “Harry R. Marshall Lifetime Achievement Award.” The award is issued at each five-year anniversary of the founding of the Virginia Beta Chapter and presented during the weekend reunion that accompanies the anniversary. The award will be presented again at the 150th celebration at the Omni Hotel on October 7, 2023.
